

Chapter 14 — "The Seventy Sevens" (Daniel 9:20-27)

"Seventy 'sevens' are decreed for your people and your holy city to finish transgression, to put an end to sin, to atone for wickedness, to bring in everlasting righteousness, to seal up vision and prophecy and to anoint the most holy." — Daniel 9:24

1. Gabriel's Visit and Answered Prayer

When did the angel Gabriel appear to Daniel while he was praying, what comforting truth did he reveal, and how does Gabriel express God's deep love and personal regard for Daniel (Dan. 9:20–23)?

What total timeframe do the seventy "sevens" represent, and what six specific accomplishments does Gabriel list that God will fulfill for His people and the holy city (Dan. 9:24)?

What key historical event marks the starting point for counting the sixty-nine "sevens" (483 years), and how does this prophecy point directly to the coming of Christ (Dan. 9:25)?

4. Events Following the Sixty-Nine 'Sevens'

According to verse 26, what three major events occur after the sixty-nine "sevens" are completed, and how do these verses point to the sacrifice of Christ and the coming destruction of Jerusalem (Dan. 9:26)?

5. The Final 'Seven' and Prophetic Fulfillment

What three events take place during the final "seven" (seventieth week), what are the primary views regarding the "ruler to come," and how did Jesus explain the "abomination of desolation" in Matthew 24 (Dan. 9:27)?

6. Encouragement in Immediate Prayer

Gabriel gave Daniel the incredible assurance: "As soon as you began to pray, an answer was given." How does knowing that God hears you and sets His answer into motion the moment you begin praying strengthen your heart while you wait?

7. Approaching Prophecy with Humility

Prophecy often becomes fully clear only after it is fulfilled, as the disciples discovered when Jesus came. Why is it so important for us to hold our interpretations of end-times details with grace and humility rather than rigid certainty?

It is easy to get caught up in complex timeline calculations when reading prophecy, but what is the grand, overarching message of hope in Daniel 9, and why must Jesus always remain at the center of our focus?

Gabriel noted that Jerusalem would be rebuilt "in times of trouble," reminding us that hardship often precedes redemption. How does knowing that God remains in sovereign control over history bring you peace during challenging times?
